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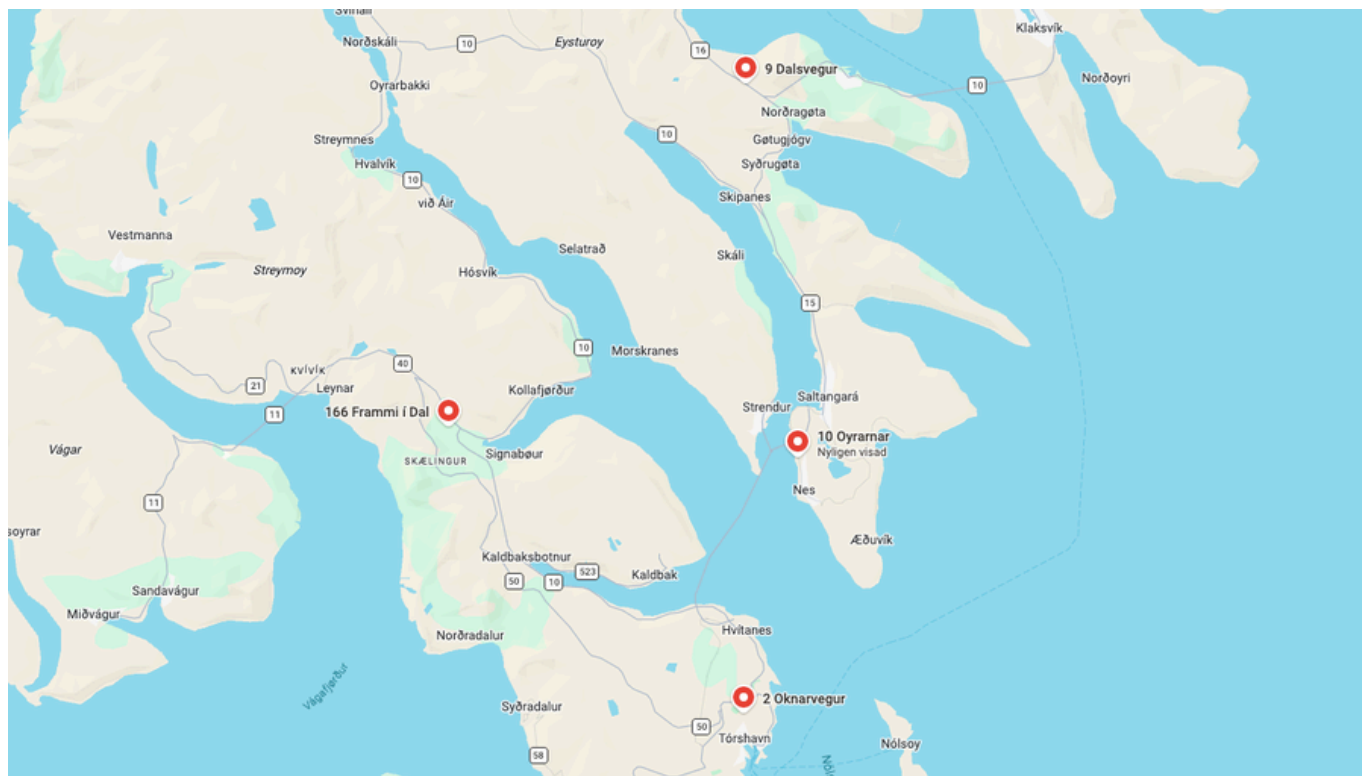

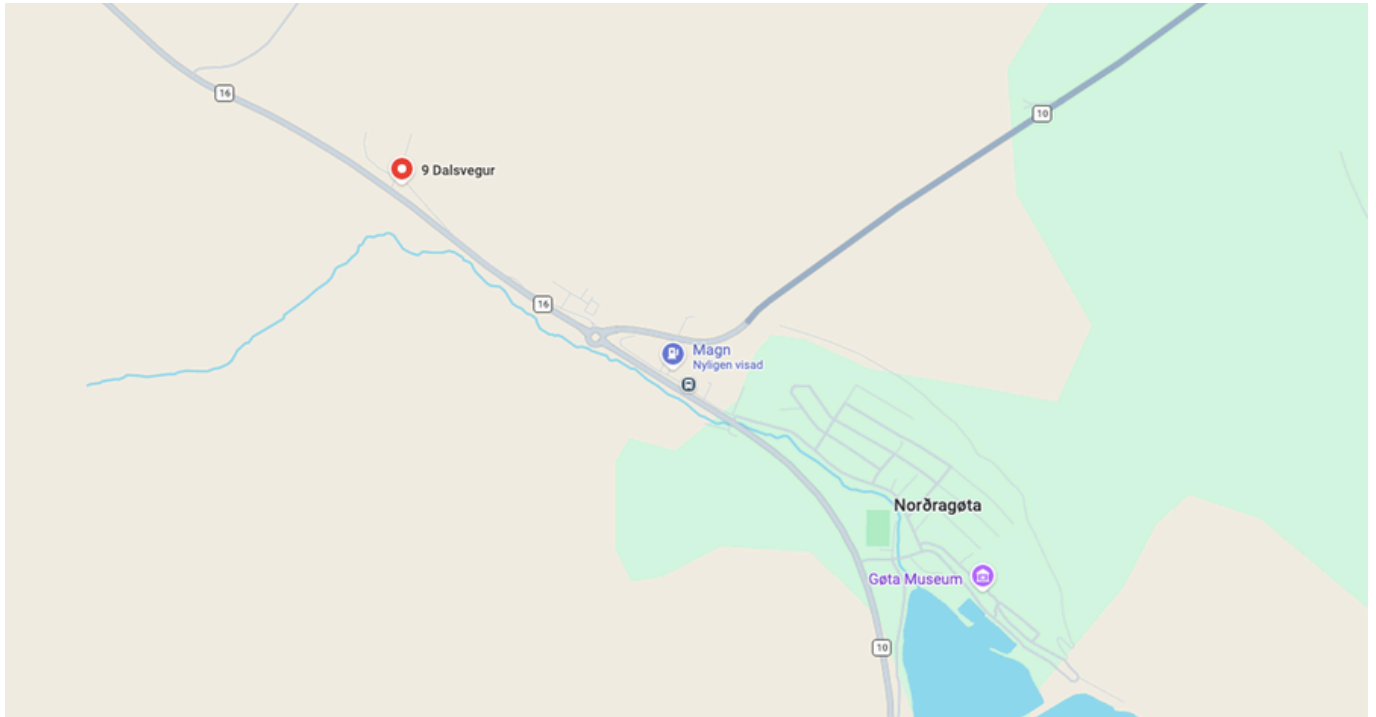


1. OVERVIEW. The four locations included in the workshop.

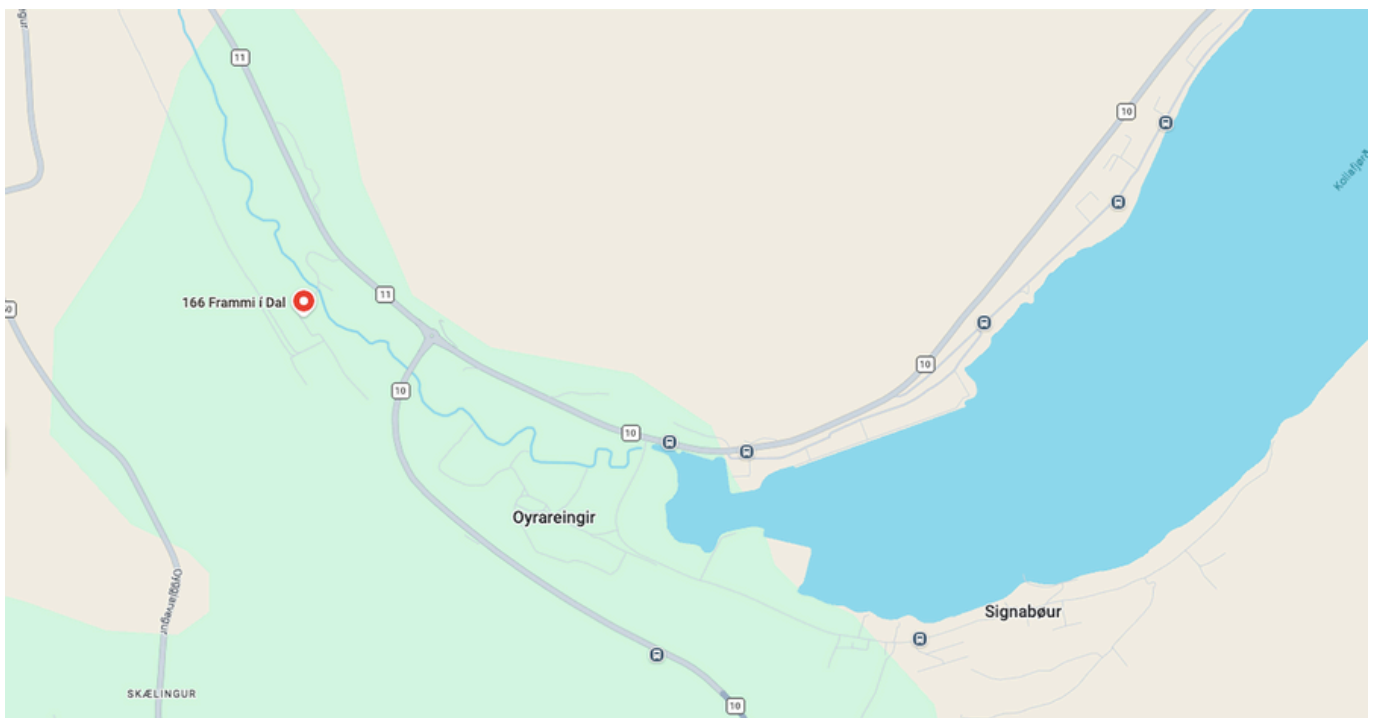


2. FIELD TRIP. Navia, yarn producer (Oyrarnar 10, FO-650 Toftir).

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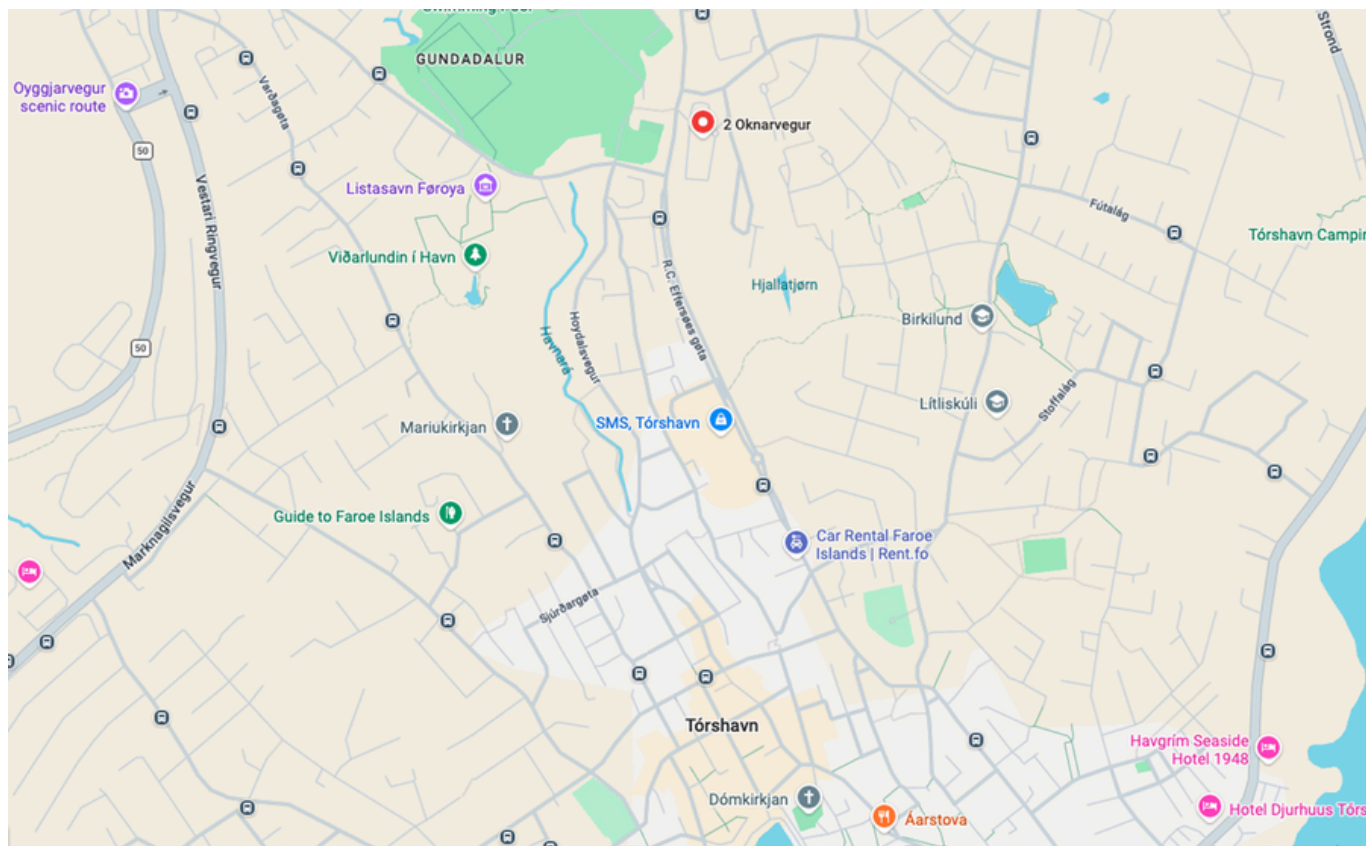
